

2020 Ironman Recipients





Cindy Drozda Demonstration



Cindy Drozda demonstrated her twisted triangle box design at this month's meeting. She began the demonstration by describing how to mark out a blank for a twisted box. Her design has three sides with a modest twist. The most difficult part in marking out the blank is numbering the center points for the multi-axis.




After the ends are marked the blank was placed between centers. Cindy's prefers using steb centers for mounting the blank. The next step was to turn tenons at each end of the blank leaving all the centers for the twisted multi-axis turning for the twist.



Now we were ready for the off axis turning. Notice that the rest is placed parallel to the bed of the lathe which makes it easy to turn a "flat" side and keep the edges of the box a continuous line.



Once a side was finished Cindy mounted the blank on the next pair of off axis points. After turning all three sides of the box and hand sanding it was time to go back to turning between centers. Cindy is meticulous about making drawings of her work illustrated by the drawing shown below of how the box pieces are sized and fitted together. The blank was mounted in a



chuck at the base end of the box and then the top was parted off.



After parting off the top she used a Forsner bit to drill a hole for the box interior being careful to not go too deep. Cindy then cleaned up the interior of the box using a custom scraper, one of many she uses. At this point she would sand the interior and apply a finish.



Now its time to finish the bottom of the box. The bottom was removed from the chuck and the top was mounted to the chuck. In the next step the tenon of the top was sized to fit the bottom of the box. Once



properly fitted the two pieces were taped together.



The bottom was then finished and sealed with CA glue to allow Cindy to later sign and date the piece as shown above right.



With the bottom removed the inside of the top was turned and a small hole drilled to accept a gem.



The top was finished using a jam chuck and starting with the tail stock supporting it.



The box was finished using a Dremel tool to etch her signature and filling with gold Lacquer-Stik.




